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FINALISTS AND WINNERS

Promotion of finalists

The ISC will promote finalists and winners to members and industry via our various media channels, including a press release, ISC website, ISC socials and dedicated communications to industry celebrating our finalists and winners. The ISC will also provide finalists, and then winners, with social media tiles to celebrate and recognise their achievement. Winners will be provided with an official winners logo, for use on their own promotional collateral.

Attendance at Award ceremonies

All finalists must register a representative to attend the award ceremony they are a finalist for. For winners of the regional ISC Awards, you will automatically become a finalist for the ISC Excellence Awards, and must register a representative to attend this event as well.

Acceptance speech

Winners will be invited on stage to make a short acceptance speech.

Winners Videos

Finalists for Excellence in IS Rated Organisations and Excellence in IS Rated Projects categories will be given the opportunity to submit a 60 second video, which will be played on the night should you win. You do not need to submit a video with your submission. Finalists will be contacted and asked to submit a video before the award ceremony date.

Finalist promotional summaries

Finalists will be asked to submit a 150 word promotional summary, for ISC to use when promoting the Awards. You do not need to submit a PR summary with your submission. When the ISC announces finalists, you will be contacted and asked to provide them then.

Photos

The application portal will allow you to upload up to five photos. You may choose to upload the photos with your submission, if you would like the judges to view them. Finalists who choose not to include photos with their submission will have the opportunity to provide them once finalists have been announced.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Submissions must be made through the ISC Awards Application Portal before the due date and time listed on page 5 of the Application Guide.

Each award has five questions. Question one will not be scored by the judges, but provides an opportunity to provide context for the judges, without having to repeat for each question.

Each question has differing word limits and weightings. Entrants are encouraged to consider the weightings when submitting answers. The application portal will only allow up to the maximum word limit provided per question.

The individual must predominantly live in Australia or New Zealand and must enter the awards in the Australian state, or NZ, that they predominantly live. They may only enter in one location.

All examples/outcomes must have been achieved in the 12 month period up to and including the closing date of submissions for the ISC Awards you are entering (see page 5 for dates).

- Uses their expertise to improve sustainability decision-making, practice and performance.
- Positively influences colleagues, clients, project teams or the broader IS community.
- Demonstrates accountability, collaboration and trusted professional behaviours.
- Contributes to stronger capability, knowledge-sharing and improved infrastructure sustainability outcomes.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The individual must be employed by an organisation or legal entity that is a current member of Infrastructure Sustainability Council.

The individual must predominantly live in Australia or New Zealand and must enter the awards in the Australian state, or NZ, that they predominantly live. They may only enter in one location.

The individual must be a current ISAP (Infrastructure Sustainability Accredited Professional)

- Actively engages others, shares knowledge or contributes to building sustainability capability.
- Shows potential to become a future leader in infrastructure sustainability.
- Has contributed to meaningful sustainability outcomes relative to their level of experience.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The individual must be employed by an organisation or legal entity that is a current member of Infrastructure Sustainability Council.

The individual must predominantly live in Australia or New Zealand and must enter the awards in the Australian state, or NZ, that they predominantly live. They may only enter in one location.

The individual must have no more than 10 years of professional experience in the infrastructure sector, and be under the age of 36 as of the closing date of submissions in the ISC Awards you are entering (see page 5 for dates).

All examples/outcomes must have been achieved in the 12 month period up to and including the closing date of submissions in the ISC Awards you are entering (see page 5 for dates).

- Has made a sustained and significant contribution to infrastructure sustainability over time.
- Has influenced industry practice, policy, standards, markets, capability or expectations beyond a single organisation or project.
- Has helped drive systemic or sector-wide change.
- Can demonstrate that their contribution has resulted in enduring, meaningful outcomes.
- Has created a legacy that will continue to influence infrastructure sustainability into the future.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The individual must be employed by an organisation or legal entity that is a current member of Infrastructure Sustainability Council.

The individual must predominantly live in Australia or New Zealand and must enter the awards in the Australian state, or NZ, that they predominantly live. They may only enter in one location.

Examples/outcomes may span the nominee's career, however entrants are encouraged to also include examples and outcomes achieved in the 12 month period up to and including the closing date of submissions for the ISC Awards you are entering (see page 5 for dates).

FAQs

Do I/we need to be a member of the Infrastructure Sustainability Council (ISC) to apply for an ISC Award?

- Excellence in IS Individuals categories - The individual must be employed by an organisation or legal entity that is a current member of Infrastructure Sustainability Council.
- Excellence in IS Organisations categories - do not need to be ISC members. Note entry fees below.
- Excellence in IS Rated Projects categories - all organisations or legal entities listed on the entry must be current Infrastructure Sustainability Council members. Where non-members are part of the project, their work can be included in the submission, but they will not be recognised as finalists or winners.

How much does it cost to enter the awards?

- There is no application fee for ISC Members.
- Non-members may enter Excellence in IS Organisations categories. The fee is AUD\$300 plus GST per submission, per region, for organisations with revenue less than AUD\$200,000, Not for Profits and Local Government Agencies. For all other non-member organisations, the fee is AUD\$600 plus GST per submission per region.

Does my/our application need to have undertaken, or be undertaking, an IS Rating?

- Excellence in IS Rated Projects categories - The initiative, innovation or approach must have been implemented on a project registered for, or that has achieved, an Infrastructure Sustainability Council Rating (IS Rating).
- Excellence in IS Individuals and IS Organisation categories - do not need to be working on an IS Rated Project.

I/we have won an ISC Award previously. Can we enter again?

Yes. Please see the eligibility criteria regarding applicable date range.

Can I/we enter more than one award?

- Excellence in IS Individuals categories - The individual must predominantly live in Australia or New Zealand and must enter the awards in the Australian state, or NZ, that they predominantly live. They may only enter in one location.
- Excellence in IS Organisations categories - The initiative/program/example must have been delivered in the region it is entered. Organisations may enter the same initiative/program/example in multiple regions. Organisations may submit multiple entries for different initiative/program/examples.
- Excellence in IS Rated Projects categories - Projects may enter multiple categories, each will be judged separately.

What name should I/we enter under?

- Excellence in IS Individuals categories - Please enter the name of the individual being nominated. This can be different to the key contact who completes the submission.
- Excellence in IS Organisations categories - Please enter the organisation name
- Excellence in IS Rated Projects categories - Will be asked to provide two names. First will be the name of the project. The second will request the organisations or legal entities you would like recognised as delivering the project. Please note all organisations or legal entities listed on the entry must be current Infrastructure Sustainability Council members. Where non-members are part of the project, their work can be included in the submission, but they will not be recognised as finalists or winners

Who will ISC communicate with regarding my/our entry?

The ISC will communicate with the person submitting the entry – the Key Contact. For Excellence in IS Individuals categories, the ISC may also communicate with the nominated person once finalists have been announced.

FAQs

Do I/we need to complete the application in full or can I/we come back and add more information later?

You can partially submit your application and come back at any time before the closing date to complete your entry.

What happens if I/we don't submit everything on time or if my application isn't complete?

Applications for each event close at the date and time listed on page 5 of the Application Guide. Any late entrants and applications missing information, over the word count or that don't meet the submission criteria will be automatically disqualified.

Who are the judges for my/our category/award?

Judges for each category will be appointed from the industry and there will be a minimum of two judges per category. For judges who elect to be promoted, their names and organisations will be released after the awards close.

Will winners be notified in advance?

No. Winners will be announced on the night at each of the Award events.

Do I/we need to be present at the event to receive the award if I win?

All finalists must have a representative attend the Award event to accept the award should they win.
